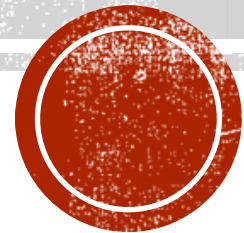

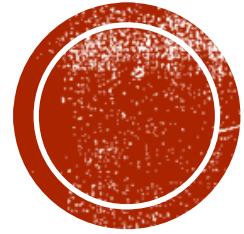

COVID EMERGENCY GRANTS

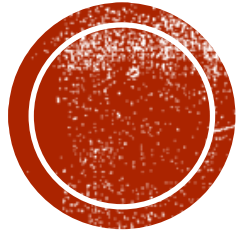
- Financial assistance to current students in need - including noncredit and undocumented students - to help cover COVID-19 school-related expenses such as course materials (books), technology (laptop, tablet, internet), housing (rent and utilities), food, health care (including mental health) and child care.

ACADEMIC TUTORING

- **SRJC Tutorial Centers**
 - The Santa Rosa Junior College Tutorial Centers provide tutoring for SRJC students needing assistance with coursework in many subject areas, at all academic levels, to individuals and small groups in a supportive, interactive environment that fosters student success and independence. Help is free.
- **Math Lab**
 - Come to the online Math Lab for live help with math and calculator problems!
- **Writing Center**
 - The Writing Center offers free, individual assistance for any writing assignment you have in any class.
- **MESA** (Mathematics, Engineering, Science Achievement)
 - With academic advising, professional mentoring, academic assistance, drop-in tutoring, small group study sessions and transfer counseling, MESA provides an environment that allows students to succeed and transfer to earn a STEM bachelor's degree.
- **Barnett Student Learning Center** (for ESL 781 students and Credit ESL Students)
- **Non-credit Tutoring and Conversation Club** (for non-credit ESL Students)

EXTENDED OPPORTUNITY PROGRAMS AND SERVICES (EOPS)

(EOPS) is a program that helps full-time, low income, educationally disadvantaged students (e.g., first generation college students, those without a high school diploma or GED, foster youth, ESL students, or those who test at low English or math levels) achieve their academic goals at Santa Rosa Junior College.

- If you qualify for EOPS, their services include: assistance with college forms, admissions, and financial aid applications, academic counseling, career exploration, Priority 1 registration, vouchers for textbooks, transfer application and fee waiver assistance, additional programs for single parents and California Foster Youths, and more.

STUDENT SUCCESS PEER COACHES ARE STUDENT EMPLOYEES THAT HELP FELLOW STUDENTS NAVIGATE THE SCHOOL AND ITS RESOURCES.

By building peer-to-peer relationships during coaching sessions, they do the following:

- Help students complete the steps to successful enrollment/priority registration.
- Help students stay on track with their educational goals.
- Work with students to develop and refine skills for success (time management, study skills, organization, etc.)

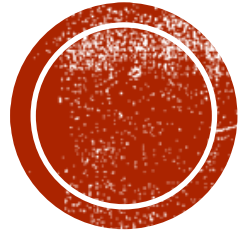
