### EXTENDED OPPORTUNITY PROGRAMS AND SERVICES (EOPS)

**(EOPS)** is a program that helps full-time, low income, educationally disadvantaged students (e.g., first generation college students, those without a high school diploma or GED, foster youth, ESL students, or those who test at low English or math levels) achieve their academic goals at Santa Rosa Junior College.

- If you qualify for EOPS, their services include: assistance with college forms, admissions, and financial aid applications, academic counseling, career exploration, Priority 1 registration, vouchers for textbooks, transfer application and fee waiver assistance, additional programs for single parents and California Foster Youths, and more.
